The sketch and rhyme shown here are from The Caddisworm, a family miscellany of verse and drawing maintained by Gertrude Powys at Montacute from 1897. The rhyme, by her mother Mary Cowper Powys, refers to the 'Mabelulu Castle' in a corner of the kitchen garden of the Vicarage where May (Marian Powys), Bertie (A. R. Powys) and Lulu (Llewelyn Powys) spent many youthful hours (see Newsletter April 1992, p. 9). The sketch, in the original placed opposite the text of the 'Mabelulu Anthem' by J. C. Powys, shows the 'noble three' raising a toast, and was drawn by Gertrude Powys.
